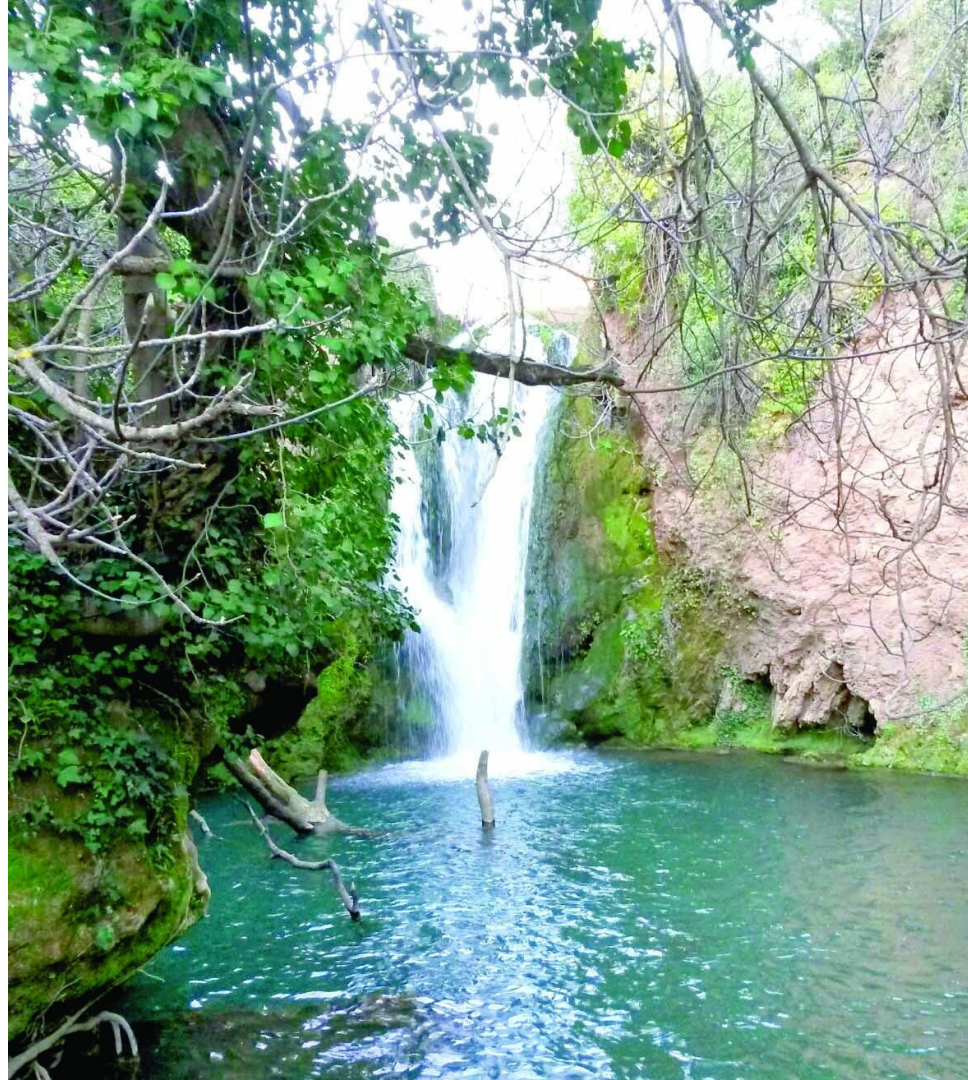


Huesna Waterfalls, Seville.

Description:

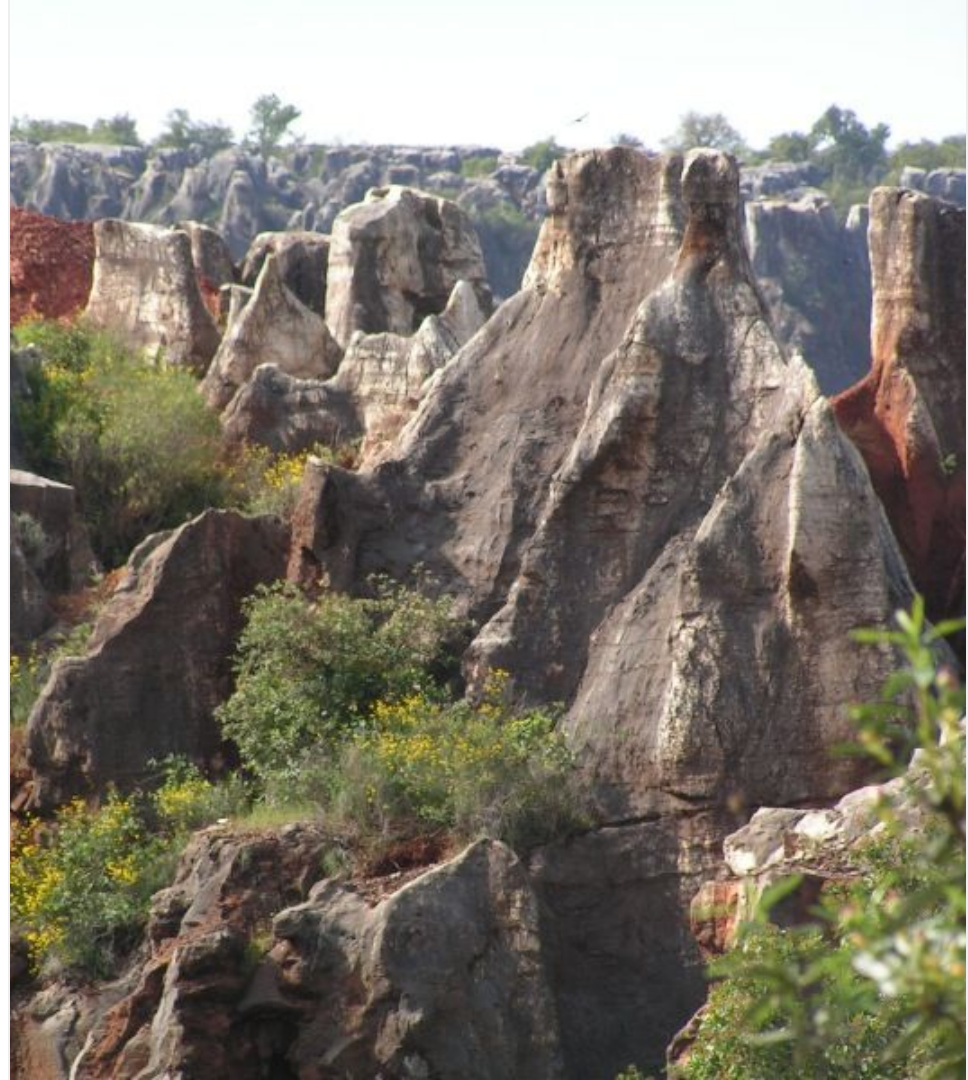
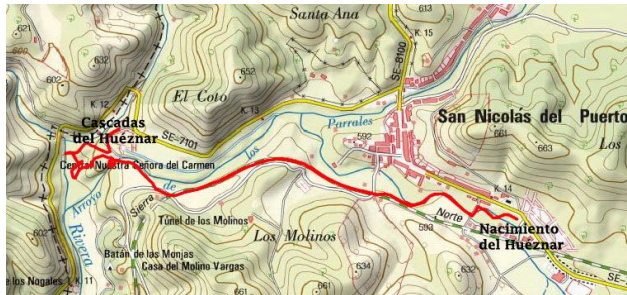
This natural monument is formed by a series of waterfalls that arise from the Huéznar river.

This riverbank, which is one of the most emblematic and best preserved in the Sierra Norte de Sevilla Natural Park, offers a landscape brimming with freshness and richness with a geology that reveals valuable information about the last 30,000 years of the region.

Throughout this succession of small waterfalls, called Las Chorreras, the river runs through its course under a spectacular forest where willows and ash trees abound, among other species. The natural monument also houses a rich variety of fauna such as the gray heron, the water blackbird, the kingfisher, the goshawk and the otter.

Location:

The Huéznar Waterfalls are located near the town of San Nicolás del Puerto, about 100 kilometers from the capital. Declaration Date: 23 - November - 2001. The Huesna Waterfall can be accessed through the Vía Verde de la Sierra Norte, an old railway route that runs through famous municipalities in the mountains, like Constantina or Cazalla, and which has been conditioned for use on foot or by bicycle. It also brings us closer to the impressive landscape of Cerro del Hierro.
