ABOUT ME

I am the son of Alexander III and ascended the throne at the age of 26 in 1894, after my father's death. I am a shy and devout man, and often ill-prepared for the magnitude of the autocracy I inherited.

I was the last Tsar of Russia, a member of the Romanov dynasty. I ruled the Russian Empire from 1894 until my abdication in 1917. My reign was marked by industrialization, conflicts such as the Russo-Japanese War and World War I, which culminated in the Russian Revolution and my subsequent execution by the Bolsheviks.

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WORK EXPERIENCE

Educational and military training (1876-1890)

• **Education:** I received a high-level, cosmopolitan private education focused on history, politics, foreign languages (I spoke English, French, and German), literature, and culture.

My tutors included prominent Russian academics, under the supervision of the conservative Konstantin.

Military Career: Unlike other members of my Romanov family who assumed active command, my military career was more formal and ceremonial.

Legal and Financial Training: I studied at the Faculty of Law of St. Petersburg University (1885–1890) and attended sessions of the State Council and the Committee of Ministers from 1889 onward to learn about state affairs.

Key points of my profile:

Limited military experience: Although I loved military life, I had never commanded troops in an actual battle before the First World War.

Preparation: Many historians considered me ill-prepared for the demands of governing a vast empire in times of crisis.

Abdication (1917): My career came to an end with the February Revolution.
